Juniors: Mandatory ACT Testing



On the morning of **Tuesday, April 24, 2012**, the State of Colorado is requiring the testing of all Juniors on the ACT. Testing will take place at Lyons Senior High for our students only.

The State testing of the ACT will be paid for by the Colorado Department of Education, and will be administered like a national test. This means the test will be free to students, and they will get some of the benefits of taking the regular ACT.

ACT **benefits** from the Colorado Dept. of Ed required April test:

- Free reporting of scores to four colleges of the students choice
- Acceptance of these scores by all Colorado colleges and universities and acceptance by most colleges & universities across the country.
- The use of information from the Student Profile section to help with college searches.

For those not planning to attend a 4 year school, ACT scores are generally required for most 2 year schools as well.

Required ACT seminars will occur in March during CSAP testing. More detailed information will be made available in our March Newsletter.

AN FYI regarding ACT testing & timing: On average students take the ACT 2-3 times (the state mandated exam in April is the only one funded by the state).

- Some students take the ACT prior to the mandated April test as a practice for the April test. If the student earns a score in the range for their anticipated college choice they are done with the ACT. If not, they may take it again in the fall (usually September).
- Others treat the April test as a practice test and plan on taking it again first thing in the fall (usually September) to meet entrance requirements/ deadlines for college.
- Just a reminder as you consider test dates, college application processes begin in October for many schools so it is highly recommended to sign up to take the September ACT test so scores are available for colleges.

The application for the FAFSA is available online. They recommend that you send it in electronically.

-FAFSA forms must be filled out with year 2011 tax information, and cannot be processed before January 1st. You can apply for a PIN # now so it is available to you when you are ready to enter your tax information. While the application can be processed anytime during the school year, many colleges and universities have a priority deadline of approximately March 1st for accessing grant and scholarship money because these funds are first come first serve.

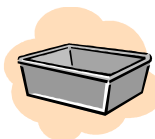

DISCOVER. INNOVATE. ACHIEVE.

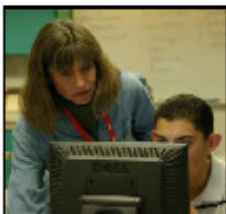
The Technology Fair is intended to provide students an opportunity to showcase high quality research projects that offer technology-based solutions to real world problems and issues.

Boulder County residents ages 14-17 can now apply for summer jobs with the Youth Corps. Girls especially are encouraged to apply. Applications are available online and at counseling offices in schools.

The deadline to submit an application is Friday, March 30.

The Youth Corps offers one of the best first job opportunities available in Boulder County. Up to 160 teenagers will be hired to work 30 hours a week, Monday through Thursday, from June 18 to August 8 on a variety of community service projects.

Projects will include such activities as thinning forests, building trails, constructing fences and doing historic preservation and landscaping.

Corps members will earn a starting hourly wage of \$7.64, with the possibility of earning a \$100 bonus at the end of the program based on merit and strong attendance. Teens who have worked for the Corps in past years can earn up to \$8.14 an hour.
