Process:

2. Look at list of available classes for 2nd semester. (posted outside of the counseling office)
3. Write on your schedule the change requested.
4. Have parent sign permission for the change.
5. Leave request in the bin on the counseling office door.
6. If the change is problematic due to credit requirements etc., Ms. Rominger will contact the student to meet with her.

This is a great opportunity for parents and students to learn about funding for college and the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) process.

February 13, 2011 at Front Range Community College, Longmont Campus. A free one day event for students and families to get professional help with completing the FAFSA process. Visit www.collegegoalcolorado.org to find out what you can do to prepare now, what tax information to bring with you and more information.

FAFSA... www.fafsa.ed.gov

The application for the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is available online. They recommend that you submit it electronically. FAFSA forms must be filled out with year 2010 tax information, and cannot be processed before January 1, 2011. You can apply for a PIN number for yourself and your student now so it is available to you when you are ready to enter your tax information. While the application can be processed anytime during the school year, many colleges and universities have a priority deadline of approximately March 1st for accessing grant and scholarship money.

SENIORS

College Applications: Make sure you have checked each school you are applying to for their deadlines, it is often best to have college applications sent in by December 31st. Many applications have a counselor/ registrar portion that may need to be completed in addition to sending official transcripts. **In order to meet late December/ early January deadlines, we will need to have your application/ transcript requests by Friday, December 10th (to be processed prior to Winter Break).**

Transcript Fees: The first transcript ordered for the school year is free. Each additional transcript is \$2.00. When applying to colleges, make sure your application is complete before requesting a transcript from the office. Please provide the address to out of state colleges.

Colorado State University Grant Program

If you are planning on attending Colorado State University, they have a new grant program that covers at least half the cost of tuition for all admitted, eligible, Colorado-resident students whose family adjusted gross income is \$57,000 or less and whose expected family contribution* is \$15,000 or less. It also covers 100 percent of tuition and standard fees for Colorado-resident students who are eligible for the federal Pell Grant and have an expected family contribution of \$5273 or less. *The College Board offers a calculator to assist families in determining their Estimated Family Contribution (EFC). www.collegeboard.com Click on "Parent", then "Pay for College", then tools.

CU Boulder's President's Leadership Class

If you are a senior, passionate about leadership, intellectually curious, and committed to serving others, you may be interested in applying to the CU Boulder's President's Leadership class. This is a four-year program and comes with a scholarship ranging from \$1000 to \$12,000 over four years. If you are interested, please come to the office for an application. The preferred deadline is January 1st.

University of Colorado at Colorado Springs Chancellor's Leadership Class

The University of Colorado at Colorado Springs offers a similar program, called the Chancellor's Leadership Class. Through coursework, community service, and mentoring, students have the opportunity to enhance their leadership abilities.
