From The Principal:

Welcome to the November edition of our school on-line newsletter. Please take the time to review the items found in this edition. Your involvement and support are critical as we move through this school year.

We are excited about the start of the school year and the number of parents and students we have involved in so many activities. In addition, we had a parent forum on October 12th and discussed a few important items. One of the items involved the option of having a 'late-start' schedule given poor weather conditions. I communicated with district officials and the response was that only running a 'late-start' schedule in the Lyons attendance area would be unlikely without purchasing additional equipment and incurring additional costs. The reason lies in that we tier our buses which means we service multiple programs and schools, so one change in a program impacts the entire system. Another discussion topic centered on offering more elective classes. We are still exploring this possibility as we plan for next year. One additional item centered on having more volunteers in the school. We are working to create a "volunteer pool" of parents interested in assisting with various needs here at the school. If you are interested in being a part of this team of volunteers, please email me and we will get you on the list.

If you missed the Parent/Teacher Conference on September 8th, please make sure you attend the next conference night on November 4th. Communication between parents, teachers, and the administration is very important in improving academic and social success.

As we enter the month of November, please take a few minutes to review the calendar and take advantage of all of the events and activities going on here at Lyons Middle Senior.

For ALL Sophomores: PLAN Test is Tuesday, November 2nd 7:45 am

All 10th graders are required to take the PLAN test. This test is preparation for the ACT, which is now required by the state for all juniors. A career interest inventory is also part of the exam and provides helpful information. There is no sign up necessary and no cost to students.

Technology Etiquette

College Applications and scholarships are increasingly technology based. Be mindful of the appropriateness of your email address, Facebook profile or any other source that is a technological reference to you. You want to make sure that these are positive reflections of you as a person and potential member of a college or recipient of a scholarship.

Look at websites for Colleges, Universities, and Trade schools you are considering and note both early application and standard application deadlines. Keep working on those applications, essays and letters of recommendation. ☺

Transcript Fees

The first transcript ordered for the school year is free. Each additional transcript is \$2.00. When applying to colleges, make sure your application is complete before requesting a transcript from the office. Please bring the college address with you at the time of your request.

College Opportunity Fund (COF)

Seniors planning on attending a Colorado college next year should sign-up online at CollegelInColorado.org. Look for the COF and apply for the stipend. You must have a valid Colorado ID.

Scholarship Opportunities

Scholarships are posted on our district website as we are made aware of opportunities on an ongoing basis. Go to the SVVSD website counseling.stvrain.k12.co.us and click on scholarships on the bottom left side.

Look for Scholarships on 3 different levels

1. **National Level** usually major companies (Coca-cola, Toyota) or foundations
2. **State/ Regional/ Local/Company**(family work place)
St. Vrain Local Scholarships will be posted on the district website mid January. Lyons local scholarships do not become available until March and information will be given to students at our school closer to that time.
3. **Institutional**- the University or College the student plans to attend.

We recently found out that we will be able to purchase the following items thanks to the generosity of the noted donors. We are ecstatic about both of these items and can't wait to get them!

A set of 5 Hammered Copper Concert Timpani: The school district is purchasing these drums for our program at the cost of \$6300 (and this is a 50% discount!!!). Our current timpani are from 1963, in extreme disrepair, and are inadequate instruments for our excellent percussionists. Delivery is expected the end of October. Please thank Rob Berry, Director of Fine Arts & Athletics - SVVSD, for funding this purchase.

Additional Marching Uniforms: Huge thanks to the Lyons Community Foundation for giving the band program \$5000 to purchase more of our beautiful uniforms. We have 55 uniforms and 60 kids – this will allow us to purchase 10 more uniforms so that we can start using them again for community performances. These will be ordered ASAP so that they can be used next fall. Please thank the Lyons Community foundation for financing these new uniforms.
