## IMPORTANT THINGS TO KNOW

High School students have all received **checklists** referencing tasks for them to complete at their grade level in preparation for their future. All students are encouraged to create an account on [CollegeinColorado.org](http://CollegeinColorado.org). This website has academic, career and college planning tools for both middle school and high school students.

### **PSAT/NMSQT Wednesday, Oct. 13<sup>th</sup>**

The PSAT (Freshman, Sophomores, Juniors) is the preparatory test for the SAT and eligibility for qualifying Juniors for the National Merit Scholar award. Students will report to their testing rooms at 7:45 A.M. Test room assignments will be posted in the high school hallway by October 4<sup>th</sup>. More info will be given to students as the test date approaches. **EARLY REGISTRATION WAS REQUIRED** and is closed as it is full. Students taking the test are encouraged to get a good night sleep, eat breakfast, come prepared with No. 2 pencils and a calculator.

### **PLAN Test Tuesday, November 2<sup>nd</sup>, for ALL SOPHOMORES**

This is preparation for the ACT, which is now required by the state for all juniors. A career interest inventory is also part of the exam. There is no sign up necessary and no cost to students. More info will be given to students as the test date approaches.

### College classes...For FREE?!?!

PSEO= Post Secondary Enrollment Options. Juniors/ Seniors may take up to two college courses at Front Range Community College or CU-Boulder per semester. These classes must be a continuation of a student's high school studies after they have exhausted our available curriculum. Tuition costs will be reimbursed after they successfully complete the classes (C or better). For those students interested in taking advantage of post-secondary classes for the **spring semester**, contact Ms. Rominger for an application packet. Applications are due **October 27th**.

## Seniors

**Please review your Senior checklist with your parent.**

Look at websites for Colleges, Universities, and Trade schools you are considering and note both early application and standard application deadlines. Start working on those applications, essays and letters of recommendation. ☺ All seniors, by this time should have completed a resume and returned it to your English teacher, or the counselor, Denise Rominger. The counseling office will use that resume to write counselor recommendations, when required, and to help select students for scholarships that require a school nomination. Students, you will also need to give a copy of your resume to teachers or community leaders that will be writing letters of recommendation for you.

### Transcript Fees

The first transcript ordered for the school year is free. Each additional transcript is \$2.00. When applying to colleges, make sure your application is complete before requesting a transcript from the office. Please bring the college address with you at the time of your request.

### College Opportunity Fund (COF)

Seniors planning on attending a Colorado college next year should sign-up online at [CollegelnColorado.org](http://CollegelnColorado.org). Look for the COF and apply for the stipend. You must have a valid Colorado ID.

## Homework Program for Middle School

In an effort to assist students who are struggling in a core subject area, failing one or more core classes, we are going to have the students report to the library during their Silent Sustained Reading time starting September 21<sup>st</sup>. (Only the 8<sup>th</sup> graders will miss a few minutes of lunch.)

We will run this program every Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday for the remainder of the school year. During this time we will have two faculty members available to assist the students in getting caught up.

Students will be able to get “Off-the-Hook” by completing missing assignments and turning in the work to the appropriate core teacher. Once this is completed, the student will no longer report to the library for “Homework Time”. Students will be able to get “Off-the-Hook” anytime during the week.

## Homework Program for High School

During the week of September 6<sup>th</sup>, Lyons High School will begin the Homework Program to support students who need academic assistance. Teachers will refer students who have a failing grade in one or more classes. Students will be required to meet with their teacher in order to obtain the work that needs to be done to raise their grade.

- Homework Program will be held in the IMC (Library) from 3:00-3:30 P.M. on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays.
- Attendance is required for all three days, failure to participate on any of the days will result in a disciplinary referral to the principal's office.
- Students will be notified of a failing grade every Friday and will have the weekend to finish work before Homework Program becomes mandatory.
- If a student is able to finish work over the weekend, or is able to raise their grade during the week, he/she can obtain an “Off the Hook” form to be signed by their teacher and will not have to attend the Homework Program the rest of the week.

This program is to help students raise their grades and get caught up with their school work.

# Attendance

**24 hour direct attendance line at Lyons Middle Senior 720-494-3844**  
Please call the attendance line if your student is going to be absent.

District board policy states that parents are required to furnish an explanation for student absenteeism either in writing or orally within two school days or the absence will be recorded as unexcused. **Once a student reaches 12 days of absences, he/she will need documentation from a health care provider to be excused from any further absences the remainder of the school year.**

**Every 7 periods = 1 day at Lyons Middle Senior.** Infinite Campus calculates a total of excused and unexcused absences and then generates a letter to alert parents when their student has reached 6 then 9 and then 12 days of absences. Health care appointments with documentation are included in the accumulation of 12 days of absences, but do prevent an unexcused tardy.

**Tardies** A tardy will only be excused if the student is arriving after a health care appointment and has documentation from that office visit. Please encourage your student to allow for weather conditions and be prompt to every class. Every three unexcused tardy occurrences will be considered a one-half day unexcused absence per board policy. Lyons high school students will be notified after six tardies in a quarter and for every additional three tardies in the same quarter, they will serve a detention per administration.

**Pre-arranged Absence.** Students and parents need to complete a pre-arranged absence form if the student knows in advance that he/she is going to be gone for **three or more** days in a row. District board policy states that if a student has poor attendance or poor academic performance, the principal may deny an excused absence for vacation purposes. **Unexcused Absences** Middle & high school students may receive 50% credit for work completed due to an unexcused absence per board policy JH.

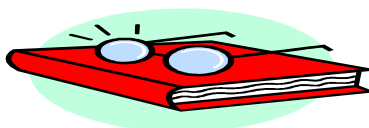

## Eye Exam & Glasses

## Tdap Clinic

There will be a Tdap Clinic on Oct. 9<sup>th</sup> at the Boulder County Public Health Immunization Office at 529 Coffman #200 in Longmont from 9:00 A.M.-3:00 P.M. The cost is \$14.50 but no child will be refused service because of inability to pay.

**IMMUNIZATIONS:** Colorado law requires children in school to have an immunization record on file and to have the required immunizations. Immunizations protect our children from disease. If your child cannot receive immunizations because of medical reasons, religious or a personal reason to exempt your child, the exemption line of the Certificate of Immunization must be signed and exempted vaccines must be listed. This certificate is available in the school health office. **PLEASE BRING IN COPY OF UPDATED IMMUNIZATION RECORD.**

<b>VACCINE:</b>	<b>How many doses are required</b>
DTP, td	5 doses are required unless the 4 <sup>th</sup> dose was given after the 4 <sup>th</sup> birthday
Tdap	1 dose is required, students will now be required to have a Tdap before entering middle school and high school
Polio (OPV/IPV)	4 doses are required unless the 3 <sup>rd</sup> dose was given after the 4 <sup>th</sup> birthday
Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)	2 doses are required, first dose on or after 1 <sup>st</sup> birthday, 2 <sup>nd</sup> dose at least 28 days later, before entering school
Hepatitis B	3 doses are required before entering school
Varicella (Chicken Pox)	1 dose is required unless your child has had the chicken pox. ( 6 <sup>th</sup> – 10 <sup>th</sup> grade only)
